Definitions

Decontamination	means a process that attempts to remove or reduce to an acceptable level a contaminant exceeding an allowable threshold set forth				
	in these Rules without changing or altering the medical marijuana form.				
Remediation	means the process by which medical marijuana flower or trim, which has failed testing, is processed into solvent-based medical				
	marijuana concentrate and the final product is tested in accordance with Oklahoma law and these Rules				

Rules

442:10-8-1. Testing standards and thresholds

- (k) Remediation, decontamination, and retesting, general. Growers and processors must, as applicable:
 - (1) Have detailed procedures for remediation and decontamination processes.
 - (2) Document all re-sampling, re-testing, decontamination, remediation, and/or disposal of marijuana or marijuana-derived products that fail laboratory testing under these Rules
 - (3) Prior to samples being taken, inform the laboratory that the final harvest batch or final production batch has failed testing and is being retested after undergoing remediation or decontamination.
 - (4) Prior to retesting, provide to the testing laboratory a document specifying how the final product was remediated or decontaminated. This document shall be retained by the laboratory together with other testing documentation.
